



"Painless" Volunteer Tasks for DUVCW EVL

Our First VP Karen Lyddne has created a list for members to use to increase our Tent's Volunteer Hours. At the end of each year she prepares her report for National and it would be great if we had a record amount of VOLUNTEER HOURS this year. So, get out there and VOLUNTEER as an individual or with a partner who lives near you.

- 1. Write an article and submit to the newsletter. Help us by reading the by-laws, for instance, and sending in bit about what you found interesting.
- 2. Visit your local United Daughters of the Confederacy (UDC) Chapter and let them know we exist!
- 3. Have a meal with a UDC member.
- 4. Find out who your local SUVCW Chapter members are, and what they are involved with. How can you support them in our name?
- 5. Is there a Veteran's home near you? Can you volunteer an hour or two regularly in our name? Tasks include clerical to making wreaths to driving.
- 6. Find out a need for a school, let us know about it, and maybe we can fund it.
- 7. Visit local museums and ask to place DUVCW brochures with the others they have for the taking.
- 8. "Adopt" a memorial and take care of it however possible (like, a significant gravesite).
- 9. Order an amount of DUVCW brochures from National, and have them in your car. Challenge yourself to distribute a certain amount every month.
- 10. Join a parade and wear your period attire and badges. Of course, have brochures "at the ready!"
