



While talking to the Voluntary Service at McGuire VAMC in Richmond, I have learned that many of our veterans are in need of warm clothing during the winter months. A particular desire was expressed for sweatshirts, sweatpants and thermal underwear. Instead of snack items for the USO, in January we are asking our members to bring these warm clothing items to be taken to veterans serviced by McGuire VAMC. The sweatshirts and pant sizes most needed are large and extra large for men. Thermal underwear is needed for both men AND women. A point of interest is that McGuire is currently serving the needs of approximately 10,000 inpatient and outpatient women.

Unfortunately, McGuire can no longer accept USED clothing. They had to revise that policy two years ago due to a contamination issue.
